Proposed bylaw amendment – December 11, 2021

Terms of Office

5. (1) Subject to subsections (3), (5), (7) and (8), an elected member shall hold office for 3 years.
- (2) An elected member is eligible for re-election for a maximum of two additional three-year terms.
- (3) An elected member may resign at any time by delivering a written notice to the Registrar.
- (4) The resignation of an elected member shall take effect on the date specified in the notice and, if no date is specified, immediately upon delivery of a notice to the Registrar.
- (5) If a member
 - (a) has not fulfilled or is unable to fulfil the duties of office due to
 - (i) non-attendance at more than 50% of scheduled Board meetings or Committee meetings to which that member has been appointed,
 - (ii) conflicts of interest as described in section 16(1)(a) to (c), or
 - (iii) physical or mental incapacity, or
 - (b) is not in good standing,

the member may be removed by a vote of 75% of all the members and the reasons for the removal shall be recorded in the Board minutes.
- (6) A vacancy in the position of an elected member may be filled by the Board appointing, as the case may be, a Dental Technician or Assistant who is eligible to be elected under section 3. (7).
- (7) When the Board appoints a Dental Technician or Assistant under subsection (6) to fill a vacancy after an elected member resigns under subsection (3) or is removed under subsection (5), the Dental Technician or Assistant is appointed to serve the remainder of the term of office of the elected member who resigned or was removed.
- (8) When the Board appoints a Dental Technician or Assistant under subsection (6) to fill a vacancy that was not filled in an election under section 4, the Board may specify a term of office for the appointed Dental Technician or Assistant that is equal to or less than the term of office for an elected member under subsection (1).
- (9) An appointment under subsection (6) must be passed by a vote of at least two-thirds of all the Board members.
- (10) Subject to the Act, and subsections (6), (7) and (8), the term of office for every elected board member who holds office on January 1, 2022 is extended by one year.
